

History of Girl Scouting in Japan

1920	<p>Girl Guiding introduced in Japan and started as 'Joshi-Hodo-Dan'.</p> <p>(Girl Guides of Japan)</p>	
1928	<p>World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) was formed.</p> <p>Girl Guides of Japan joined as one of 26 founding members.</p>	
1949	<p>The movement restarted in Japan after suspension during World War II, and 'Girl Scouts of Japan' was established.</p>	
1960	<p>Girl Scouts of Japan became a Full Member of WAGGGS.</p> <p>Togakushi Girl Scout Center was built in Togakushi, Nagano.</p>	
1966	<p>The 19th World Conference was held in Tokyo.</p>	
1970	<p>The 50th Anniversary of Girl Scouting in Japan.</p>	
1984	<p>Girl Scout House was built in Shibuya, Tokyo.</p>	
1985	<p>The first "Troop on Foreign Soil" established in Malaysia.</p>	
1988	<p>Declared May 22 as 'Girl Scout Day', and one week before and after May 22 to be 'Girl Scout Weeks'.</p>	
1993	<p>The Peace Pack Project was launched in response to WAGGGS' Peace Initiative.</p>	
2000	<p>The 80th Anniversary of Girl Scouting in Japan</p> <p>New Togakushi Girl Scout Center building was opened.</p> <p>New Promise and Law were adopted.</p>	
2010	<p>The 90th Anniversary of Girl Scouting in Japan</p> <p>New Uniform was introduced.</p>	
2020	<p>The 100th Anniversary of Girl Scouting in Japan</p> <p>Centenary events launched but had to change the plan because of the impact of COVID-19.</p>	
2021	<p>Pre-event of the International Girls' Expo was held through online.</p>	
2022	<p>International Girls' Expo was held through online.</p> <p>100th Anniversary Camp was held at 7 venues.</p>
